

By car: When coming by car from A1 highway, change at the "Bremer Kreuz" onto the A27 highway in the direction of Bremen-Bremerhaven. Leave the A27 at exit "Universität / Horn-Lehe" and head towards "Centrum / Universität."

Ample parking is available on campus and at the University Technology Park. There is a parking fee of 1 € per day on the outer parking zones and 1.50 € per day in the underground car park.
